Domaine Heresztyn, Gevrey-Chambertin, En Billard, Vieilles Vignes, France, 2010 £ 65

What's that, Sir? Only a single vineyard Pinot Noir from low yielding vines grown in an outstanding vintage will do? Well, look no further.

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Chateau Pontet-Canet, Grand Cru Classe, Pauillac, France, 2008 £ 150

Chateau Pontet-Canet, owned and operated by Alfred Tesseron, has 81 hectares of vineyards all of which are farmed following Biodynamic practices – this monumental commitment is testament to their dedication to producing wines expressive of their terroir with an undeniable sense of place within the bouquet and flavour. The 2008 vintage is what the Tesseron family like drinking as their house wine, so it should be okay.
